Yesterday I arrived safely at my son's house after we drove for 10 hours. As I prayed for clear weather God granted us His guidance for comfort and safety. Although I am not the best passenger when it comes to long distance travel, my son enabled our trip down to Virginia not only bearable, but he stopped several times for bathroom breaks and refreshments to energize our bodies. My body is declining every day which is different from a few months ago when I thought I was doing well but I don't seem to have the energy as I use to. Even during these changing times at the age of 85, I have learned to accept God's

good and safe plan for my life as I empty my heart for His will to be done.

When we arrived, my daughter-in-law prepared a wonderful Korean dinner. I felt even more welcomed as I saw their beautiful and clean house. Talking to my grandchildren I soon realized

that it wasn't a dream, but I was finally with my son's family. I got emotional as I quietly cried with sincere joy in my heart that first night.

Early in the morning I opened my eyes and realized it was only 3 AM and all I remember was going to bed early the night we arrived. Not to be a burden to my son and his family, I brought an electric kettle to boil water in my room so that I could have my favorite cup ramen. I often wonder if I might be addicted to ramen but if it brings me comfort, I am happy.

Later that morning, my daughter-in-law and my granddaughter left for Atlanta to stay one night before making their drive to Mississippi to help Tarah's sister before her surgery. I can't imagine how much was on Tarah's mind with my arrival and then having to drive down to Mississippi to help her sister. But I knew she would overcome the challenges of life because her faith is strong and like the Korean saying, "blood is thicker than water" which means family is priority.

I prayed for God's blessing for Andrew and David as they had a busy Christmas season as Andrew just finished leading a retreat and David coming up to get me. Later that morning, David and Andrew went to their respective churches, and I was grateful for their burning desire to serve our Lord. I believe they are doing their very best and I truly believe they are doing God's Holy work to prepare the church for the New Year.

I was given the master bedroom which is unlike my room in Toronto. It is so spacious that it brought much satisfaction for me even though I felt guilty for taking David and Tarah's room. There are so many windows that brings in the warm sunshine and I can enjoy the rain fall so peacefully. I am blessed to have my son and daughter who takes good care of me. My sister Elizabeth is six years younger than me. She is a high school teacher in Toronto and for 22 years, she has taken care of my mother. Her husband John Christianson is such an amazing son-in-law as he makes sure mom's needs are always met. When they found out I was bringing mom down to Virginia, they couldn't believe it at first because mom always worried about the health insurance issue just incase she got sick in the States. This time, mom's younger brother and sister are both going to be in the United States visiting their children, so the incentive was to rendezvous in Virginia next month to spend time together too.

Having mom this time around is extra special for me because in the Korean culture, the oldest son usually takes the full responsibility of caring for their parents when they retire. Although I missed so much of

mom's journey after the passing of my father, I hope to make it up to her and help her make more wonderful memories with her grandchildren. I will be bringing her to our Sunday service soon but there are no guarantees as she has trouble walking and sitting for long periods of time. We had lots of little kids then, and my grandkids were a part of that group. Grandson, Caleb, was part of the "Kinderchoir." There were others, all of whom have now grown and gone on their way and who we see occasionally at church.

There was also the youth bell choir. These were older kids who also played the hand chimes and were an enthusiastic and musical group of young people. All of them have gone on with their lives and some now have children of their own. In cleaning out my "stuff" from the Bell Room, I found the many charts of bell music I have written through the years for these young musicians to follow.

I must say that my time at choir director has been somewhat unusual as most of it has occurred during a pandemic when all the rules seemed to have changed.
