


Pastoral Column — November 2023



Why Do We Sing "Meditation Hymns"?

It is not because the choir needs a break. It's not because anyone is lazy. It's because I feel quite strongly that ALL OF US are part of the Church music ministry. You may have noticed that the number of choir members changes from Sunday to Sunday, sometimes making it difficult to plan, and consistently rehearse. Hence, the choir will sing generally twice a month; and on the other Sundays, the larger Church choir... aka... all of us... will sing.

Besides, it's a nice opportunity to just stay seated and prayerfully sing a hymn which can help us prepare our hearts to hear the word read and preached. The hymn may or may not be familiar to you, but it's one that will have the same theme as the scripture or sermon. Feel free to sing just listen, but the intent is to learn and sing meaningful songs as we worship, and to include everyone in bringing music to the worship service.

Can I Join the Choir?

Yes, you sure can. We welcome new folks. We have been working on Advent and Christmas music, so now is a great time to come. We rehearse on Thursday evenings from 6:45-8:00 p.m. You do not need to read music. You do not need to have a wonderful solo voice. If you do, that's terrific, but I just ask you to come with a heart to sing and a desire to become part of something meaningful to our worship experience. And the chairs up in the chancel area are very comfortable!

Winter Peace Taize' Service

We will have a Taize' service at 4:00 p.m. on *Sunday, December* 10^{th} . This is a quiet, meditative service that includes candlelight, singing, soft guitar and piano music, meditative readings and periods of silence. What better way to spend about 35-45 minutes on a late Sunday afternoon during a very busy and hectic time of the year? If you have not attended this type of service, just come. You won't be asked to do anything except to come and enjoy the time. We look forward to your joining us.

Writing Guide 2023

The theme for Advent Worship and the Advent Devotional is **Our Spirit Waits**. As Advent comes, we begin the Christian year anew with a season of waiting. As the days grow darker, we draw closer to the arrival of the Light that turns the world upside down—or right -side up! The journey toward and beyond the manger is one of reversing expectations, encountering what we thought we already knew in brand new ways, and receiving good news in unexpected places. So, with one foot in the prophets and another in the Gospels, we journey together as our spirit waits to welcome the Christ child and carry hope, peace, joy, and love as we live as disciples who anticipate the now-and-not-yet kingdom of God.

What are your stories of waiting and/or preparation that are part of your Advent/Christmas experience? What are your experiences of

discovering hope, peace, joy or love in the midst of life with all of its blessings and trials? Please write one of these as a short devotion to share with your Bethel Church family. Or if you are uncomfortable writing the devotion, share it orally, and we'll write it for you! You can even submit a drawing or photograph that portrays an Advent/Christmas experience.

A devotion is a sharing from the heart with a connection to a scripture passage. It is written for the purpose of inspiring us to have hope and joy each day through the experience of Christ who has come in our lives. It begins with a scripture passage of one or two verses. Next there is a short story that relates to the passage and ends with the point you are wishing to make. A short prayer related to the story comes at the end. Be yourself in writing a devotional. Keep it short and to the point. You don't need to use theological or intellectual language, unless that is your style. Think about others reading this and how they might benefit. Our booklet will be published electronically and as a traditional paper booklet.

As you consider your story, reflect on the following questions, the scriptures, and the actual Sunday message title for that week.

What do we see?

What do we hear, followed by what are we doing about it?"

How are we living the promise in our communities right now?

How are we lighting a light that others might see and find their way into this relationship?

What stories will we tell? What examples will we live out?

How will we make our space ready to receive the one who comes and the family invited to share?
