

Don't Stop the Music!

When was the last time you held and paged through a hymnal while in worship? In the quiet moments before worship, or at another time, I encourage you to do that. Just not during the sermon... LOL

While the words to our hymns are projected on the screen, making it easier for many to read, I think we lose something special and meaningful when we don't hold a hymnal in our hands and read it from time to time. When a hymn is announced in worship, consider turning to the page in the hymnal and singing from it for something different. I don't know about you, but I'm a book person. I like to feel the weight of a book in my hands and feel the pages in my fingers. No Kindles or E readers for me.

When I pick up a hymnal, I wonder who else has held that very one and sung the hymns of our faith. Did they have a favorite hymn? Did they sing out or simply read the words as others sang? To whom is it dedicated? Sometimes there will be a dedication engraved on the cover or on the inside cover. I think about those persons, their families, and the roles they had at Bethel Church. The next time you are in the sanctuary, I encourage you to look through a hymnal. If there's a dedication, do some research and learn about that person. Some of our long-time members can tell you about them.

If you take the opportunity to look through the hymnal or research a dedication, tell me what you learned and I will include it here next time. Until then, Following John Wesley's Direction VII for Singing: "Above all, sing spiritually. Have an eye to God in every word you sing."

Hooray for January Snow! If the public school system announces a weather-related closure, Bethel Church will automatically be closed for all services, activities and meetings. If the snow event occurs on a week-end you will be notified via email from Ava Lee. The front office will endeavor to update the Bethel telephone message.

If snowfall is heavy we will hire someone to come in with equipment to move the snow. Most snow removal services are taking care of the school and business parking lots first so we may have to "wait our turn". But please be assured that we make every effort to get everything clear and safe as quickly as possible.

If the snowfall is only a couple of inches deep we can't bring in a plow because it will strip away the parking lot surfaces so we salt and sand the areas.
