A Church on the Move

Our congregation is on the move! Literally, we are moving our church offices to the house next door, preparing the Parsonage as a home for Pastor Nadeem and his family. At the same time, Pastor Nadeem is getting bids to move their family from their home in Blackstone to their new community at Bethel. And it is not just us and them – during the last week of June, United Methodist pastors all across the commonwealth of Virginia are moving - north and south, east to west, and all manner of places in between. Even Pastor Clayton will be coming out of retirement to become pastor of a small church part-time. Lots of moving. United Methodists know all about moving. But are we moving forward? That is the question we need to ask ourselves. Are we moving forward?

Yesterday, April 23rd, marked the beginning of the United Methodist Church's General Conference. Over 800 delegates, representing churches throughout the world, have gathered in Charlotte for this ten-day meeting. Bishop Bickerton, president of the Council of Bishops, gave the opening day sermon. He acknowledged that these last several years have been challenging United Methodists. Some members have chosen to leave. Some congregations have

"disaffiliated", choosing to no longer to be a part of the United Methodist Church. Over 25% of our congregations have withdrawn. 7000 churches. (Sounds like a pretty bleak sermon so far. It got much better).

Bishop Bickerton said, a year ago, he was called on to speak at the Texas Annual Conference. He said he really didn't know what to expect. In the Texas Conference, Fifty-two percent of the congregations had chosen to leave the UMC. He wondered to himself if the conference might be filled with self-doubt, pain, dismay, defeat. Instead, what he found was not a conference lost in self-pity, but a conference filled with holy energy and ready to move forward. They were proud to be called United Methodists, and they were ready to see where God wanted to take them. And Bishop Bickerton said what he heard from people the most, was that, unlike past sessions of the Texas Conference, this year "every single one of us wants to be here." And the young clergy and laity were leading the way. They said, finally, they could come to annual conference not expecting to fight and argue, but to celebrate their common faith, to renew their sacred call, and move forward to share the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Bishop Bickerton said it all begins with being still. "Be still and know that I am God." The first step of moving forward, is being still.

Do you want to move forward spiritually? Do you want to follow Christ wholeheartedly? Begin by being still. Pause, so you can be fully present in God's presence. That is the very best first step.
