

Infrastructure Grant Application

Bethel UMC has an exciting opportunity to apply for an Infrastructure Grant for up to \$200,000 through the Northern Virginia Methodist District. These grants are designed to increase the missional impact of the church by offering financial support for infrastructure projects and to reduce existing infrastructure debt.

Pastor Nadeem along with Ava Lee, Council Chair, Roger Broadbent, Trustee Chair, Rick Putnam, Trustee, and Rosanne Williamson, as the grant writer, is the Bethel team preparing our application due to the district on Friday, January 31, 2025.

To fulfill the infrastructure needs at Bethel we are requesting this grant to (1) replace the shingles on the church roof and the towers (2) repair and pave the parking lot, (3) install a sidewalk for safer access to our Parish House where our offices and youth space are located, and (4) build an outdoor worship/recreation space. Finally, we will request the remaining debt of \$44,000 from our last capital project be funded.

The Bethel projects total to \$228,200 and Bethel Church will be requesting from the grant a total of \$193,000. In order to show good faith on the part of the church, the grant requests a 15% church match or in our case, a total of \$34,200.

On Sunday, January 26, 2025 at the grant informational meeting following the worship service, attendees asked many good questions
