Message from the Pastor

Dear Bethel Family,

We have entered the fourth week of Lent, and my hope and prayer are that you are taking this opportunity to engage in spiritual work during this season. Fasting, spending time in prayer, reading the Bible, and self-examination are valuable practices to deepen our relationship with God and with others. Lent invites Christians to make necessary changes by letting go of things that hinder our growth into maturity and completeness. This could include bad habits such as gossip, anger, overspending, procrastination, favoritism, addiction, or any other negative behaviors that need to be addressed.

If your health permits, fasting can be particularly instrumental as you work toward significant changes in your life. Self-examination leads to repentance, which prompts change, and repent-

ance fosters a better relationship with God and with others. Jesus fasted for forty days and forty nights before beginning His earthly ministry. As followers of Jesus, we are encouraged to fast and pray, and I hope you will consider this important spiritual discipline. Additionally, as we continue our journey toward the cross, I would like to extend an invitation to join us at Bethel for the Holy Week services. The services are listed below.

Holy Week Palm Sunday

Palm Sunday celebrates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem the Sunday before his resurrection. Mentioned in each of the four Gospels, the Bible story of Palm Sunday tells us that Jesus entered the city knowing He would be tried and crucified and welcomed His fate to rise from the grave and save us from sin! Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, the remembrance of Jesus' last days.

Holy Week Taize' Service

Join us on Sunday, April 13th at 5:00 p.m.in the sanctuary.

Begin your journey to the cross on Palm Sunday evening at 5:00 p.m. in the quiet of the sanctuary.

A Taize' style service is a quiet, contemplative service that includes prayers, songs, readings and quiet periods. The sanctuary will be lighted with candles. Come early. Music will begin at 4:40 for you be still, shake off the day; and consider your role in the journey to the cross with Jesus.

Would you walk with him? Would you hide? Would you stay through all of it? Give yourself the opportunity to spend time in the quiet and the beauty of the candles. The service will last about 35-40 minutes. No preaching, no offering. Just readings, singing, prayers and time to think.


Holy Week Good Friday

Good Friday is a critical worship experience for our Christian faith. This does not only carry theological significance in Christian traditions, but also reminds us of the pain, sorrow, suffering and crucifixion of Jesus Christ. Christ would like to see us at the feet of the cross, reflecting and pondering the meaning of that great sacrifice before we shout "He is Risen" on Easter morning. In this service, we will focus on the last seven words that Jesus spoke on the cross. Join friends and family on *April 18, at 7:00 p.m.* Service will also be live streamed.

We will continue Bethel's traditional Easter Sunrise service on Easter Sunday morning and the service will be held outside at 6:45 a.m. Come and join Bethel Church to shout "He is Risen" with the rising of the sun.

Easter Garden on the Old Rugged Cross

As Easter morning approaches, please consider donating some spring flowers to adorn our Old Rugged Cross outside the social hall. It's become a Bethel tradition, and looking out on that magnificently flowered cross as the sun rises during our Sunrise service is just breathtaking! And it makes for a great photo op for family pictures too.

Please bring some cut flowers — either from your garden, or store bought — when you come to the Good Friday service at 7pm on Friday, April 18; Saturday, April 19; or Easter morning. Our members have also pruned smaller flowering branches from their own magnolias, redbuds, dogwoods, forsythia and the like, and added them to the cross too. There will be buckets of water on the first table as you enter the church and just outside the front door. Just place your flowers into one of the buckets when you arrive on Good Friday or anytime that Saturday. Our early birds to the Sunrise Service on Easter morning will place the flowers in the chicken wire that's wrapped around the cross. The palms that we waved on Palm and Passion Sunday will already be on the cross to serve as a beautiful background for your flowers.







Bethel is blessed to have a local quilt artist, Sara Rayaprol, share her lovely work with us during the season of Lent. When asked about her inspiration, she wrote the following:

What if we could wrap the Earth in a Tallit?

If you aren't familiar with this prayer shawl, it is a personal tent, if you will, or covering. When I'm covered by my Tallit, I feel a strong sense of God's presence and peace. My quilt visualizes the Earth wrapped in a Tallit and filled with God's peace, love, hope, and light.

This idea came from a vision I received when thinking about my love for all humanity and how God's children are suffering and dying in the recent wars! Peace and unity in love should be for all mankind! These two things have to begin in every heart. I pray that you can share my vision of peace as you look upon my quilt.

The Hebrew blessing on the Tallit translates to: "Blessed are you, Lord our God, King of the universe, who has sanctified us with His commandments, and commanded us to enwrap ourselves with tzitzis."

Imagine A World at Peace is displayed above the information table in the Social Hall. Please take a few minutes to pray for peace, personally and for our communities, as you enjoy the artwork.


